The events began with all four year groups and all students competing tutor versus tutor in the tug-o-war. The Clyst Vale slope having it's usual influence as tutor groups battled for supremacy. Straight afterwards the groups moved on to rounders where once again the efforts and enthusiasm abounded as tutors sought to pick up points early in the day. With the athletic events now into action the students took to the track, runway and take off boards to run, throw and jump against their peers. This year more than ever the support and solidarity among students was evident everywhere as hugs, congratulations and shoulders to lean on were offered. 

FARMER

The job role of a farmer includes planting, tending to, and harvesting crops such as wheat, barley, and vegetables, while also ensuring soil health through sustainable practices like crop rotation and soil enrichment.

Livestock farmers manage the welfare and productivity of animals, including cattle, sheep, and pigs, ensuring they are well-fed, housed, and monitored for health issues.

Farmers must be knowledgeable about modern agricultural technologies and techniques, utilise machinery for planting and harvesting, and comply with environmental and safety regulations.

On average, a farmer's salary ranges from £20,000 to £30,000 per year for those working on small to medium sized farms. Experienced farmers managing larger operations or specialising in high-value crops or livestock can earn between £35,000 and £50,000 annually.

Clyst Vale Inter-House Girls Euro 2024 Football Winners are France of Green!

Congratulations to the winners of the Girls Euro 2024 tournament of France, who pipped fellow Green House team Scotland in the final last Friday afternoon. Despite dry conditions greeting both teams and the bronze medal match competitors, the rain soon swooped in to make it a wet lunchtime, however it did not dampen the skill and competition of all involved.

The Bronze medal match up of Slovenia (Green) and Spain (Yellow) ended with a 1-0 narrow win for the former, which meant a 1,2,3 finish for Green House across the week.

Principal, Ms Jacobs, welcomed both finalists to the pitch before the anthems, with Scotland trying to make it a double following the success with the Boys competition a week earlier.

It was Scotland who led early on with a stunning Annie G strike from the edge of the box which rifled in in the top left corner of the goal. France rallied and dominated possession and gained a well-deserved equaliser through Sophia T.

The game ended level at 1-1, with the game progressing through the golden goal extra time and then to penalties. Scotland had form with this method as they knocked out rivals Spain in the semi final a day earlier. This one would go all the way, with France ending up 6-5 winners with the spot kicks going through several rounds of sudden death.

Congratulations to France for their victory and commiserations to Scotland who were solid throughout and very hard to beat. Thank you and well done to all students and staff who made both weeks a real highlight and a positive way to round off the year.

Attendance, Absence and Requests for Absence

Reporting an Absence

Parents are expected to inform us of their child's absence before 9.00 a.m. on each day of absence providing the reason for absence. If the absence continues beyond the first day, please contact the College on each subsequent day of absence, too. To comply with safeguarding obligations, we cannot simply assume a student's sickness absence is ongoing; we need to be certain that the reason for absence is due to continuing illness. If you do not notify the College, then we will make contact with you to identify the reason for absence. This is important as it helps to reduce unauthorised absences and truancy. In addition, the College may ask you to provide medical proof if your child is absent from College due to illness.

Lateness

The school day (first registration session) starts at 8.50 am, all students are expected to be in their classroom at this time.

Medical Appointments

We encourage students to maximise their levels of attendance; research indicates a direct link between attendance and examination performance. The timing of many medical appointments means that often students can attend school first and return afterwards. By doing so, students minimise missed learning whilst keeping their attendance levels as high as possible. We ask that parents/carers send their child into school for morning registration, even when a medical appointment takes place in the middle of the morning. Similarly, appointments scheduled for the afternoon should, where possible, be arranged after Period 4 - during lunchtime. Students are encouraged to return to school after a lunchtime appointment if they can.

Please give the school as much notice as possible, at least two weeks' notice is useful.

If the appointment requires the pupil to leave during the day, they must be signed out by an adult listed on the student's record at the main reception.


